GEELONG UNITED BOYS DEFEAT WANGARATTA WARRIORS BOYS – U18 VICTORIAN BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Geelong United are Victorian Under-18 Country Championships premiers after an epic five-point win over Wangaratta.

In a see-sawing battle that saw several lead changes in the final quarter, it was United who held their nerve in the dying stages to claim victory, 47-42.

It is the team's first Boys Under-18 Championships title after a merger between Geelong Supercats and Corio Bay Stingrays. With under two minutes on the clock scores were level until Geelong's Leo Burgess hit a clutch three-pointer and a skipper Jet Kneebone **(11 Hurtado)** steal and lay-up iced the game.

Coles praised Kneebone's leadership and his team's ability to rally under pressure.

Sean and Claudia Beattie hold no less than eighteen (18) combined individual records for Saint Ignatius in our House Swimming Championship records over the history of the carnival. Sean holds the longest record in the pool with his 13 Years 50m Backstroke record still yet to be broken that was set in 2010. When Sean's sister Claudia arrived in Year 7 she did not hesitate to break her own records. Her 2011 13 Years 50m butterfly record of 40.09 is a ten year record still going today.

The oldest record we have yet to be broken is that of Kate McIntosh's 14 Years 50m Backstroke record of 38.30 that was set in the year 2000. Kate also holds two more records dating back more than 20 years ago.

(CNN)<u>Naomi Osaka</u> powered her way to a second <u>Australian Open</u> title with a comprehensive straight sets victory over grand slam final debutante Jennifer Brady.



It was the first grand slam final with a significant crowd since last year's Australian Open and with both players producing shots of the highest quality -- in particular during the first set -those lucky enough to bag a ticket were treated to a spectacle.
