Broden Bond (9 Thomas) has put all 800m & 1500m runners in the State on notice after a sensational regional qualifying Athletics carnival in Newport last weekend.

Broden hedged his bets trying to qualify for the 400m, 800m and 1500m for the State Championships this weekend and has qualified in all three events in fine style.

"Before Covid-19 hit in 2020 I had qualified for the State championships in these same events but the competition got cancelled, "said Broden.

"Winning two gold medals (800m & 1500m) and a silver in the 400m at Newport was the result of my hard work over the last twelve months to be honest."

Evie Lewry (8 Chardin) will also race this weekend also in the 400m and 800m. Evie's two silver medals last weekend in Newport guaranteed her a start in the state championships as well.

The 2021 Commonwealth Bank State Track & Field Championships will be held at Lakeside Stadium on Saturday 13th and 14th March. The 800m finals for Evie and Broden will take place this Saturday morning and afternoon.
